

## THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ASHFIELD-COLBORNE-WAWANOSH

## **BY-LAW NUMBER 86-2024**

**BEING A BY-LAW** to establish a policy for new or replacement outdoor play equipment on municipal lands in the Corporation of the Township of Ashfield-Colborne-Wawanosh.

**WHEREAS** Section 11 of the Municipal Act, 2001. S.O. 2001, c. 25 provides that a municipality may pass by-laws respecting matters within the sphere of jurisdiction of parks and recreation;

**AND WHEREAS** the Council of the Township of Ashfield-Colborne-Wawanosh adopted a policy for new or replacement outdoor play equipment on municipally owned lands on July 16, 2019;

AND WHEREAS Council adopted a Concept Plan for Parks on November 5, 2024;

**AND WHEREAS** Council deems it desirable to amend the policy to reflect the adoption of the Concept Plans for Parks;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Ashfield-Colborne-Wawanosh enacts as follows:

- 1. For any new or replacement outdoor play equipment on municipal lands, the community will spearhead the proposed project in collaboration with municipal staff to ensure adherence to this policy.
- 2. Prior to any work, Council shall approve the project by resolution.
- 3. The community will fund the cost and installation of the outdoor play equipment.
- 4. The community may make a written request to Council to contribute financially to the project.
- 5. The project shall be in compliance with the Design of Public Spaces Standard of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005, including a consult of the project with the Huron County Accessibility Committee.
- 6. The project shall align with the current Parks and Recreation Strategic Plan as well as the Concept Plans for Parks adopted by Council.
- 7. The purchasing of the outdoor play equipment shall follow the Township's Purchasing Policy.
- 8. The community will purchase the outdoor play equipment from a reputable contractor who will manage and certify the installation.
- 9. All outdoor play equipment must be designed and constructed to contract specifications, details, manufacturers and Canadian Standards Association standards.

- 10. At project completion, the contractor will certify the installation prior to use by the community.
- 11. Outdoor play equipment donated or purchased by the local community or any other third party will become the sole property of the Township.
- 12. Future maintenance and insurance are the responsibility of the Township.
- 13. If, at the discretion of Council, the outdoor play equipment needs to be removed or relocated for any reason, the Township reserves the right to remove, relocate and/or dispose of any outdoor play equipment in any manner deemed appropriate.
- 14. This by-law repeals and supersedes By-Law 52-2019.
- 15. This by-law shall come into force upon final passing.

Read a first and second time 17<sup>th</sup> day of December 2024.

Read a third time and finally passed this 17<sup>th</sup> day of December 2024.
