Requested Assistance from Township in 2020

- Strip off topsoil and re-grade the site
- Installation of water service and hydro lines to the pavilion location
- Placement of Granular A along the sidewalk routes and parking area
- Spread topsoil of the areas to be seeded down and place seed
- Sand within the Gaga pit Area and if possible provide construction guidelines for Gaga pits
- Information Kiosks
- Installation of another light with the park

Request from the Township

- 1. Permission to reconstruct these lots similar to the proposed site plan.
- 2. Provide tax receipts, hold donated funds collected, ie. bank account.
- 3. Assistance hiring Contractors and paying the bills associated with the work.
- 4. Complete the site work as outlined



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
